The September 13, 2018, Shillington Borough Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President John W. Hoffert. Following the invocation by Mayor Hivner and the oath of allegiance, roll call was taken. Council members Elizabeth M. Bentz and Edward B. Michalik were absent. As there were no objections, the minutes of the August 16, 2018, council meeting were approved as forwarded to each member, on a motion by Dr. Clark, seconded by Mr. Klee, and duly carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Leonard Hoffert apprised Council that he has been experiencing sewer backing up into his property again. He did not have it during the heavy rains that flooded the area of Lancaster Avenue and Museum Road. But, it happened during lesser rain events. He questioned whether the sewer lines in his area had been televised lately.

Mr. Johnson reported that most of the Borough's system has been televised and grouted. Flow metering is

being considered to determine the amount of storm water infiltrating the sanitary sewer system.

President Hoffert advised that the sewer lines in Mr. Hoffert's area will be flushed again to see if that alleviates the problem.

Mr. and Mrs. Kowalski attended the meeting regarding the same issue and had nothing additional to add.

COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS: None.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Mayor</u> - Mayor Andrew R. Hivner gave the Police Department's report for the month of August. During this month, the Department handled 444 incidents, with 76 arrests being made. Also during this month, 2,802 patrol miles were traveled.

Council approved the payment of \$3,063.88 in overtime paid

<u>Fire</u> - Mr. Michael A. Hoffert, chairman, gave the Fire Chief's report for the month of August. During this time, the Department responded to a total of fifty-four (54)

dispatches consisting of twelve (12) calls in the Borough and forty-two (42) assists to neighboring departments. The Department also conducted four (4) training sessions during the month.

The members covered all of the 184 hours of available daytime staffing for the month.

<u>Streets-Sanitation-Water</u> - Mr. John W. Hoffert, chairman, reviewed with Council the September Engineer's Report. He noted the following:

°Reamstown Excavating completed the work on the residential curbs and is continuing to work on the ADA ramps. Paving is tentatively scheduled for September.

President Hoffert then gave the report of the Public Works Department for work done during the month of August.

<u>Recreation</u> - Dr. Clark, member, gave the minutes of the September 10, 2018, Recreation Board meeting.

A comparison of the budgeted numbers versus the actual numbers for the 2018 summer programs was discussed.

Zoning - Mr. Conrad Vanino, chairman, gave the Borough's Building Code Official's report for the month of August. During this time, three (3) new permits were issued, eighteen (18) certificates of use/occupancy were issued and thirty-seven (37) permits remain open.

<u>Solicitor</u> - On a motion by Mr. Michael Hoffert, seconded by Mr. Vanino, and unanimously carried, Council gave permission to file a lien on the following property:

Application No. 1 of the 2018 Streets Improvement Project from Reamstown Excavating in the amount of \$73,133.10 for work completed on the residential curbs and the ADA ramps was approved for payment, on a motion by Mr. Klee, seconded by Mr. Michael Hoffert, and duly carried.

This application was also reviewed and approved by the Borough Engineers.

The Borough's Minimum Municipal Obligation (MMO) amounts for the Police Pension Plan and the Non-Uniformed Pension Plan for the year 2019 are as follows:

Dr. Clark made a motion, which was seconded by Mr. Klee, and duly approved, giving authorization to prepare and advertise an ordinance to close Waverly Street on Saturday, November 3, 2018 for the Governor Mifflin Music Association's "Strike Up the Bands."

QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

Mr. Stupp questioned whether there is a need to close the windows during the mosquito spraying that is being done in the Borough.

Mr. Mountz advised that this work is being done by the County, not the Borough, but that he is not aware of a need to close the windows.
